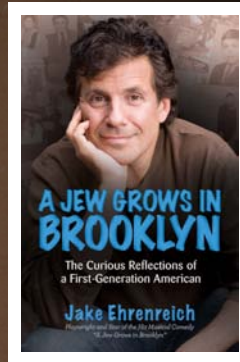

He has appeared on Broadway in *Dancin'*, *Barnum*, and *They're Playing Our Song*, off Broadway in an assortment of starring roles, and toured internationally as Ringo in *Beatlemania*. He's been featured at New York's Rainbow Room, the Kennedy Center in DC, and on numerous TV shows and national commercials. He has performed, recorded and toured with Richie Havens, Greg Allman, Del Shannon, Jay Leno, John Davidson, Tito Puente, and the Smothers Brothers.



He's the author of the new book, "A Jew Grows in Brooklyn, the Curious Reflections of a First Generation American," from the publishers of the "Chicken Soup for the Soul" Books.

A TV documentary and a related feature film are in the works.
